Hello everyone and welcome to the Spring edition of the SIL Newsletter.

You may well be aware of a lot of coverage in the media about the impact of the latest national budget on organisations as a result of increases in the cost of the National Insurance we pay. This comes at a time when many Social Care providers are struggling anyway, and has added a great deal of pressure across the sector.

I am pleased to say that SIL is in a reasonable position to deal with the increase in costs and that we are continuing to grow and expand our services.

We are however, like many organisations, heavily impacted by the amount the local authority pays us to provide services and we are currently waiting for the rates for 2025/26 to be announced.

The impact of the budget on Social Care has been picked up nationally and there are a range of activities taking place to make the Government aware of the potential implications. It is interesting to note that there was a large march to Parliament Square in London this week, but that it got very little attention from the mainstream media. I'm sure that wouldn't have been the case if it was about the NHS; please do make this point if for any reason you have contact with your local MP, or local councillors.

I hope you all have a wonderful Spring and that we see some drier and warmer weather over the next few months.

Helping Hand for Isolated Communities



The Severn Wye Energy Agency is a sustainability charity working across Wales and the English border counties supporting people to overcome fuel poverty and providing expert, impartial advice on energy efficiency and renewable energy generation.

They use their 25 years' experience to support tenants, homeowners, landlords, businesses and community organisations to manage their energy use, stay warm and healthy, cut costs,

and contribute to the UK's net zero goals

Much of their work is with people living in isolated rural areas who can't typically access regular sources of advice, and more recently they supported a group of Ukrainian residents who were passionate about understanding the UK energy system and but been unable to find help elsewhere. The issues helped with are common to many other communities, including advice on the priority services register, fuel vouchers, energy credit, incorrect tariffs, and smart meter installations.

They give community-based support through events and home visits for eligible clients, and can offer sessions and materials in multiple languages.

Blue Monday Conference

SIL, Hereford Men's Mental Health Group (HMMH) and Community Fund worked together to provide a mental health conference for mental health professionals in Herefordshire that focused specifically on Men's Mental Health. The event was seen as an opportunity within the county to help continue the conversation around Men's Mental Health and provide networking opportunities between organisations in Herefordshire that work in the mental health field. Through funding acquired through the Community Fund, SIL and HMMH were able to organise the conference, and it was agreed to host the event on the 20 January, Blue Monday.

The day provided several guest speakers from the field of mental health as well as a Q & A and networking session. Many of the organisations represented had stands where delegates were able to collect information and make links with other groups.

The event highlighted several areas which delegates will now work on to forge better links enabling more targeted and effective support to men in Hereford who are struggling with their mental health. These measures will include more collaborative working, clearer signposting between organisations, raising the profile of support available, recognising fathers as one of the more vulnerable groups, and doing more in the field of suicide prevention.

Clever Betsy is an ECHO Social Enterprise project providing Day Opportunities for adults with learning disabilities. They are a tight knit team of paid staff, volunteers and participants who vary in age and ability.

Based in Leominster they are an arts & crafts project with a particular focus on upcycling and producing a range of high

-quality crafted items to sell in the ECHO shop and various other outlets within the community.

supporting your autistic family member

Are you the parent of an autistic child or adult? Would you like to gain additional understanding of their needs and support for your own?

www.thecartshed.co.uk

March 6th 2025, for six weeks. Four-hour session from 10-2 each Thursday.

Various topics will be covered across the course, which may help you to understand the needs of autistic people in your life. Each session will be rooted in neurodiversity affirming practices and run by individuals with lived experience. The course will also allow you to meet other parents with caring responsibilities alongside developing skills to manage your own well-being.

The sessions will take place in a quiet woodland environment at The Cart Shed, with an opportunity to gain experience of woodland craft skills, such as willow and rush weaving and whittling. Both parents are eligible to attend. This course is open to parents responsible for a person with an autism diagnosis, or self-identifying. These sessions are fully funded (which means you do not have to pay anything).
